..... *Road Safety Workshop, Ilorin, Nigeria*

A workshop on road traffic injuries and prevention is being organized the Trauma Unit of Ilorin Teaching Hospital, and the WHO Country Office to commemorate the launch of WHO's World Report on Road Traffic Injuries Prevention (WRRTIP) on World Health Day. The workshop will commence on the 7<sup>th</sup> till the 9<sup>th</sup> of April 2004. There will be four sessions with topics including the magnitude of the problem in Nigeria, specific injuries sustained, problems encountered and interventions; practical demonstration of pre-hospital care by critical rescue and prevention strategies. Participants expected include legislators at state and federal levels with stakes on road traffic injuries, administrators at local, state and federal levels concerned with road traffic injuries, corporate organizations and safety departments, road engineers, doctors and nurses interested in emergency care, car industries and insurance organizations.
