Disability Inclusion

What do we mean by disability?

Persons with disabilities include those who have long-term physical, mental, intellectual, or sensory impairments which in interaction with various barriers may hinder their full and effective participation in society on an equal basis with others

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Disability Inclusion

What do we mean by inclusion?

Inclusion is to remove the barriers that exclude people with disability and their participation from the society.



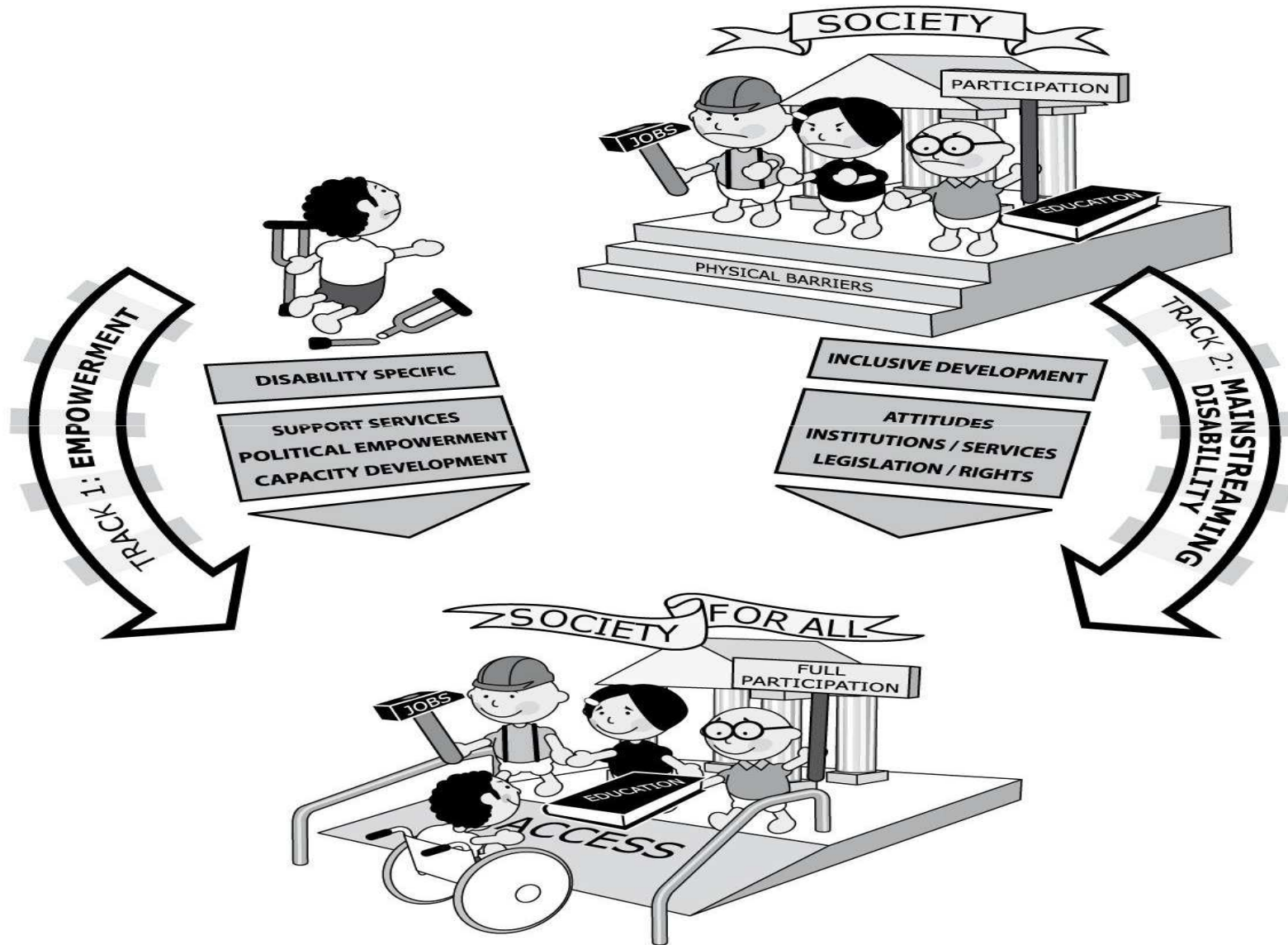

Disability Inclusion

Why is it important ?



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- Formerly known as the Landmine Survivor Assistance Program (LSAP) 2007-2010
- 2.5 year program extension to Dec 2012
AusAID funded ARC managed program

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The importance of a name

- The shift from ‘landmines survivors’ to an ‘initiative for disability inclusion’ represents an important re-positioning of the initiative
- It is an evolving process
- Embraces wider issues around disability – social, inclusion, empowerment, rights
- Forward thinking

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Program goal

Improve the quality of life of people with disabilities in Cambodia by supporting national efforts towards addressing the risks, causes and consequences of disability.

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CIDI focus

Three broad areas:

1. Government
2. (I)NGO and DPO Partner networks
3. Cambodian Red Cross

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1. Government – to support an enabling policy environment

- Working with the RGoC to promote disability inclusion in Cambodia
- Support the CIDI partner network to implement the National Plan of Action (NPA- PWD)
- Technical and capacity development support to DAC & MoSVY – working group for preparing UN CRPD ratification and Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) committee

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2. Support to civil society

- Disability Inclusion Assistance Fund (DIAF) - a funding mechanism open to civil society partners.
- Capacity Development support built into the program
- Networking function

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3. Cambodian Red Cross

- Support to strengthen capacity to provide improved community based mine action programs (CBMAP)
- Community Based Health Development Program (CBHDP) including WATSAN, health & hygiene education...
- Road Safety – focusing on inclusion
- Disability mainstreaming across projects

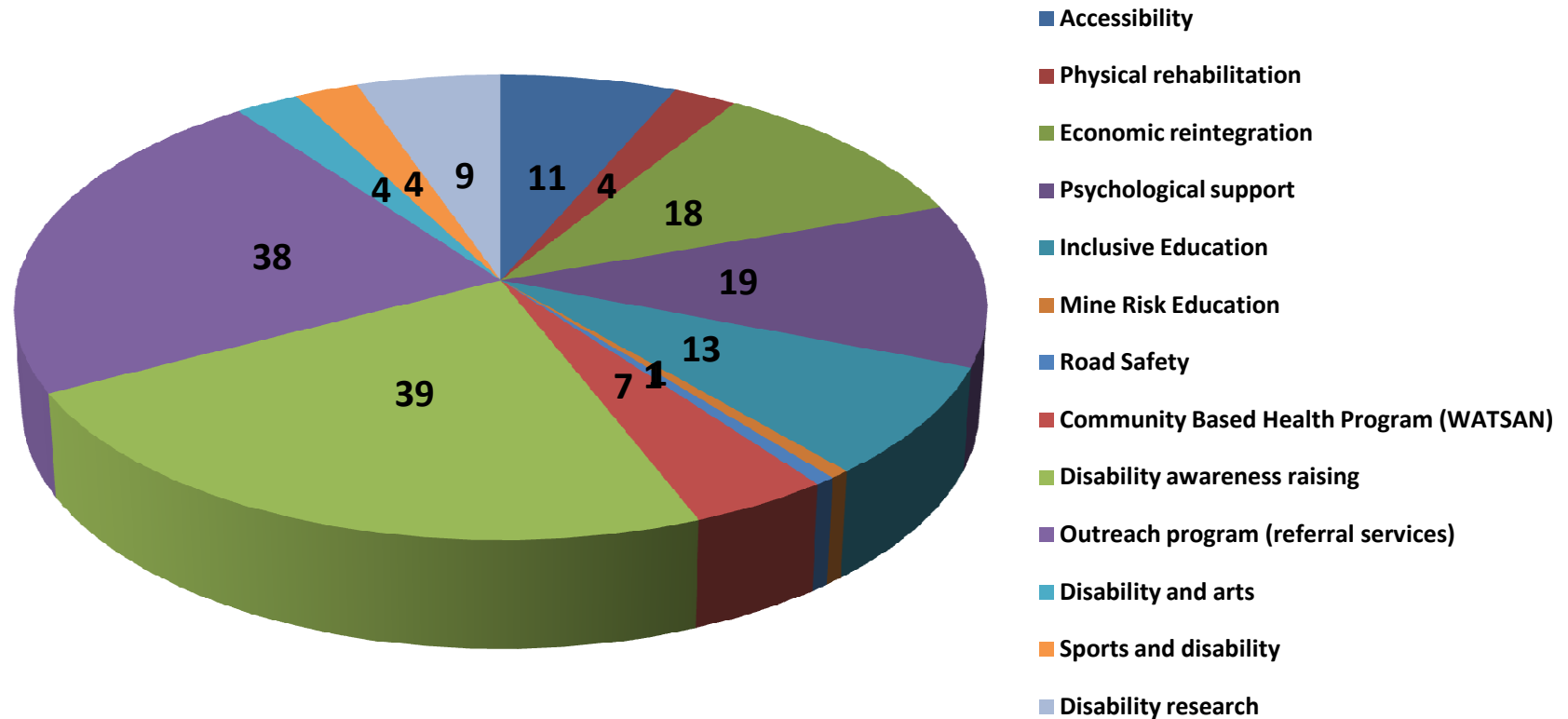

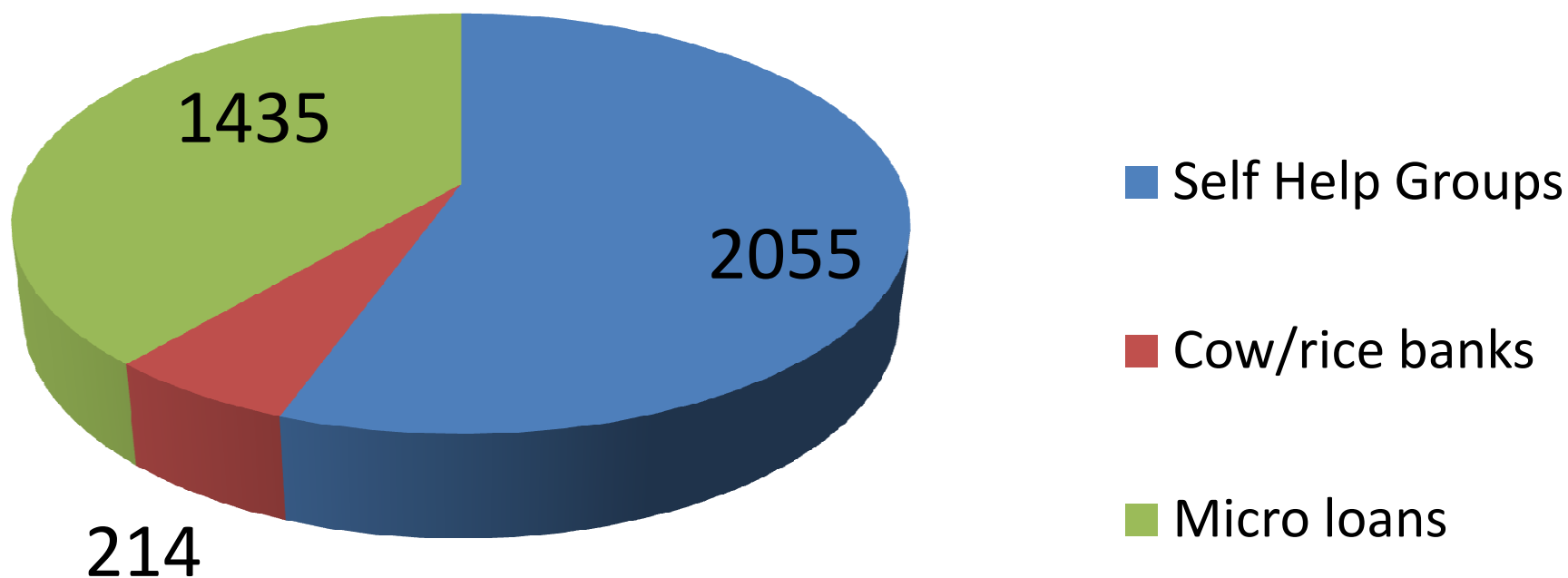
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Number and type of services providing to people with disability and their families through CIDI partners



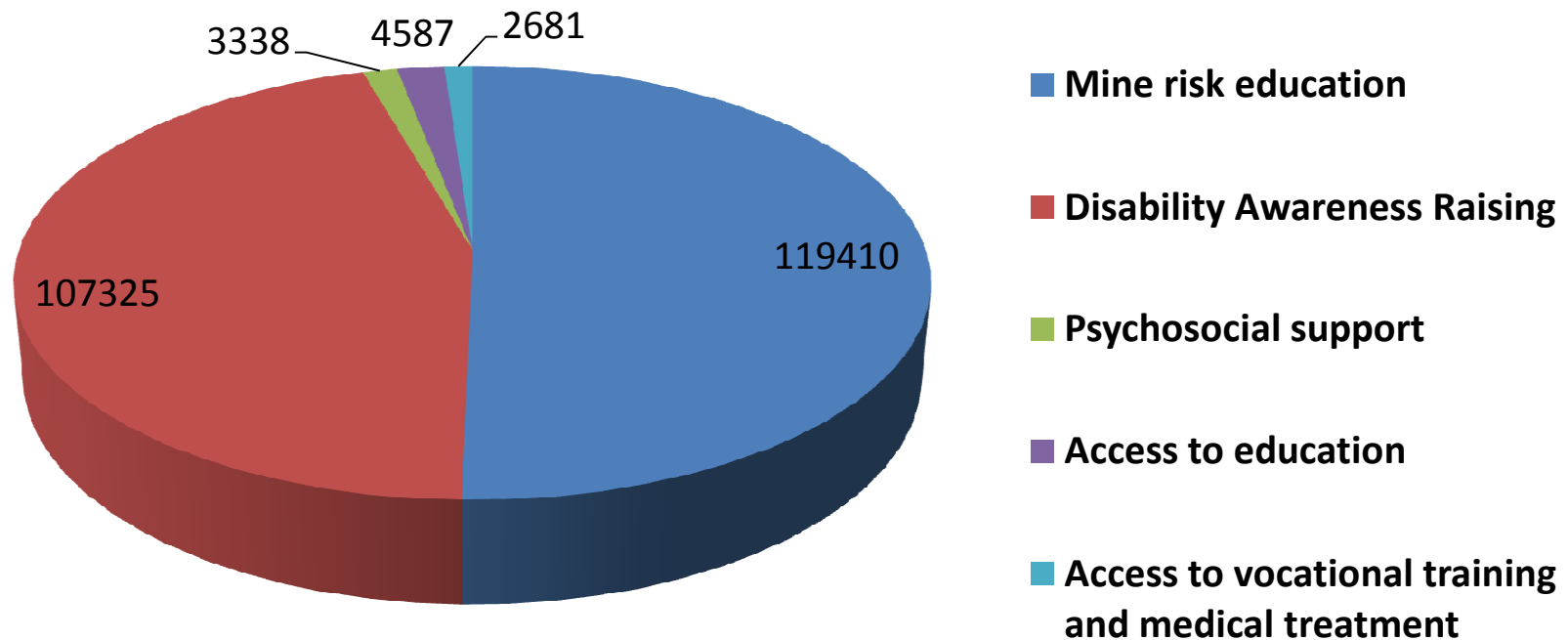
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Number of individuals involved in income generation activities
